STATE TEAM SELECTION POLICY

EVENTS:

National Youth Archery Championships (NYAC)

National Archery Championships (NAC)

National Indoor Archery Championships (NIAC)

Separate South Queensland Archery Society (SQAS) State Teams shall be selected for each Championship.

YOUTH TEAM

Up to 10 Compound archers and up to 10 Recurve archers (from any youth age group, male or female)

Interested archers **must**:

- Be a current financial member of SQAS /Archery Australia.
- Agree to the "Athlete Agreement" and sign at the time of acceptance of your position on the SQAS State Team.
- Be in and remain in "Good Standing" with SQAS.

Interested archers should:

- Submit the Expression of Interest (EOI) located on the SQAS website.

1. SQAS Qualifying Requirements:

The Archery Australia "Archers Diary" National Ranking List (RGB/SQAS Section) in each of Target and Field and the RGB Ranking List for Clout will be used to rank all SQAS youth archers.

The selection period commences from and including the first event of the previous years' NYAC and closes eight (8) weeks prior to the first event of the NYAC for which the team is being selected.

Each archer's ranking as at the closing date will be used to select the team from those who have entered the Youth National Championships in the Target, Field and Clout events. (An



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archers ranking will be based on the **published** ranking lists eight (8) weeks prior to the commencement of the event).

In addition, the minimum qualifying classification rating at the close of the qualifying period will be the **'Red'** classification for each Division as follows:

- Refer to the AA Constitution & Rules on the Archery Australia website to find the 'Red' classification level for your division and age group. [Example: For a Cadet Male Compound, their latest classification rating would need to be at least 55.]
- Then in Archers Diary, under Tools & Info, Rating Calculator, enter your Class (see note below), gender, division, round type, round and the rating established from (a) above. This will give you the minimum score required for the 'Red' classification.

Note: Any archers(s) who will be moving to the next age group at the Youth Nationals (Cub to Intermediate; etc) will need to shoot rounds applicable to the higher age group to fulfil the above requirements and will need to prepare accordingly (e.g. shooting some QREs in the higher age group).

Archers must compete in each of the Target, Field and Clout events at the Youth National Archery Championships.

Archers must have been a member of SQAS for a minimum of three (3) months prior to the end of the qualifying period. However, an archer who does not fulfil this requirement may be invited on the team if the team has not already been filled by archers who have met all the qualifying requirements.

2. Team Selection:

Archers will be ranked in each of Target, Field and Clout using the **published** Archers Diary National Ranking List (for Target and Field) and the RGB Ranking List (for Clout). Once it has been ascertained who will be attending the Youth Nationals the top five (5) ranked Target archers, the top three (3) ranked Field archers and the top two (2) ranked Clout archers will be recommended for the SQAS Compound and Recurve Youth Team.

If an archer is listed in the top group on more than one ranking list, a second pass will be made, first from the Target list, then Field and then Clout, and so on until the team is filled, if possible.

SQAS reserves the right not to nominate a full team or to invite other archers to be on the SQAS team.

3. Team Uniform and Funding:

- SQAS will provide team members with one SQAS State Team shirt
- SQAS may make an allocation for team funding, which will be allocated to team members or used for team support.

4. Other:

Team members shall agree to wear the SQAS uniform for the Official Opening Ceremony, team photographs, medal presentations and on any other appropriate occasions as



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requested by the Team Manager. During competition team members may wear appropriate clothing of their choice, including that of sponsors.

During competition, it is desirable for team members to wear the SQAS shirt, as it will assist the Team Manager in identifying and locating SQAS archers quickly.

All SQAS Youth Team members will be requested to contribute to a report on the Youth Nationals to the Team Manager after the event.

Participation in State Team development camps and/or programs is mandatory for Team members. A leave of absence for genuine reasons may be granted at the discretion of the SQAS Management.

The SQAS Management Committee's decisions with respect to team selection and the interpretation of these criteria shall be final.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAM

Up to 4 Compound Men and 4 Compound Females

Up to 4 Recurve Men and 4 Recurve Females

Archers **must**:

- Be a current financial member of SQAS /Archery Australia.
- Agree to the "Athlete Agreement" and sign at the time of acceptance of your position on the SQAS State Team.
- Be in and remain in "Good Standing" with SQAS.

1. SQAS Qualifying Requirements:

Archers competing in either the Open, Masters or the Veteran Divisions at the National Championships are eligible for selection in the SQAS Team.

The Archery Australia "Archers Diary" National Ranking List (RGB/SQAS Section) in each of Target and Field will be used to rank all SQAS archers in Compound and Recurve male and female.

Selection period commences from and including the first event of the previous years' NAC and closes eight (8) weeks prior to the first event of the NAC for which the team is being selected.

Each archer's ranking as at the closing date will be used to select the team from those who have entered the National Archery Championships in the Target and Field events. (An archers ranking will be based on the **published** ranking lists eight (8) weeks prior to the commencement of the event).

In addition, the minimum qualifying classification rating at the close of the qualifying period will be the 'Red' classification for each Division as follows:



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- Refer to the AA Constitution & Rules on the Archery Australia website to find the 'Red' classification level for your division and age group. [Example: For an Open Female Recurve, their latest classification rating would need to be at least 60.]
- Then in Archers Diary, under Tools & Info, Rating Calculator, enter your Class (see note below), gender, division, round type, round and the rating established from (a) above. This will give you the minimum score required for the 'Red' classification.

Archers must compete in each of the Target and Field events at the National Championships.

Archers must have been a member of SQAS for a minimum of three (3) months prior to the end of the qualifying period. However, an archer who does not fulfil this requirement may be invited on the team if the team has not already been filled by archers who have met all the qualifying requirements.

2. Team Selection:

Archers will be ranked in each of Target and Field using the **published** Archers Diary National Ranking List. Once it has been ascertained who will be attending the National Championships the top four (4) ranked archers in each Category who have fulfilled the team selection criteria will be invited on the SQAS team for the National Championships Team event.

SQAS reserves the right not to nominate a full team or to invite other archers to be on the SQAS team.

3. Team Uniform and Funding:

- SQAS will provide team members with one SQAS State Team shirt
- SQAS may make an allocation for team funding, which will be allocated to team members or used for team support.

4. Other:

Team members shall agree to wear the SQAS uniform for the Official Opening Ceremony, team photographs, medal presentations and on any other appropriate occasions as requested by the Team Manager. During competition team members may wear appropriate clothing of their choice, including that of sponsors.

During competition, it is desirable for team members to wear the SQAS shirt, as it will assist the Team Manager in identifying and locating SQAS archers quickly.

The SQAS Management Committee's decisions with respect to team selection and the interpretation of these criteria shall be final.

NATIONAL INDOOR TEAM

Recurve Team – up to four (4) archers of any class (age/gender) see Archery Australia Rules x3.2.6.



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Compound Team – up to four (4) archers of any class (age/gender) see Archery Australia Rules x3.2.6.

Archers **must**:

- Be a current financial member of SQAS /Archery Australia.
- Agree to the “Athlete Agreement” and sign at the time of acceptance of your position on the SQAS State Team.
- Be in and remain in “Good Standing” with SQAS.

1. SQAS Qualifying Requirements and Team Selection:

Archers may shoot as many valid scores as they wish subject to the following condictions:

- Round: WA 18 metre Indoor Round 60 arrows – Inner 10 for all Compound archers).
- Rounds may be shot at either AA registered QREs or alternatively at Official Club events, properly conducted by the Club using Archers Diary.

The Archery Australia “Archers Diary” RGB **published** Ranking List of Indoor will be used to rank all SQAS archers in both Compound and Recurve. Each archers ranking as at 30 days prior to the commencement of the National Indoor Championships for which the team is being selected will be used to select the State Team.

For each team, the top four (4) ranked archers who have entered the National Indoor Championships will qualify for the SQAS Indoor Compound and Recurve Teams. Should an archer decline to be part of the team for any reason, the next ranked archer will be invited on the team, and so on until the team is filled.

Archers must have been a member of SQAS for a minimum of three (3) months prior to the end of the qualifying period. However, an archer who does not fulfil this requirement may be invited on the team if the team has not already been filled by archers who have met all the qualifying requirements.

SQAS reserves the right not to nominate a full team or to invite other archers to be on the SQAS team.

2. Team Funding:

- SQAS may make an allocation for team funding, which will be allocated to team members or used for team support.

The SQAS Management Committee’s decisions with respect to team selection and the interpretation of these criteria shall be final.
